Minimal recommended fly list for alpine: Adams Traditional 16: Parachute Adams 14: Blue Wing Olive 18: Blue Dun 14: Elk Hair Caddis Crystal 14: Royal Wulff 12, 16: Elk Hair Caddis Brown 14, 16: Renegade 10, 14: Griffith Gnat 16,18,20: Wooly Bugger Olive/Brown 10, 12 (beaded and non-beaded): Mosquitoes 16,18,20: Pheasant Tail 12,14 (beaded and non-beaded): BH Prince Nymph 10, 12, 14: Royal Humpy 14: Wooly Worm Black 10, 12, 14: Wooly Worm with red tail 10, 12:Lime Trude 16: Orange Stimulator 12,16: Dave's Hopper-brown and green 8, 10.

If you are serious fly-fisherman, bring your “arsenal” of flies in color variations, as you never know what trout will be eating on any particular day.

Recommended spin-cast lures: Small Mepps and/or Rooster Tails 1/8 to 1/16 oz in a wide array of colors with a preference to earth tone. Float Bubbles (small egg shaped and clear) to use with dry flies. Monofilament line 2 to 4 pound test works best.

FISHING LICENSE INFORMATION

Fishing licenses are required – for resident and nonresident anglers 14 years or older. Exceptions are waters where fishing preserve permits, special limited fishing permits, or landowner fishing regulations apply.

We recommend 3-5 wt. fly rods and lightweight 5-6X tippet for your dry fly presentations. On windy days you may prefer sinking line, however small non-toxic bead shot works good for sinking nymphs. Nets and waders are usually unnecessary bulk, however if you have lightweight packable waders, you are welcome to bring them. On fly-fishing trips we may have float tubes with neoprene waders available for the group to share if desired.
